- 1. Call to order by Bob (L) Scott
- 2. Proof of notice determined
- 3. Roll call, quorum established.
- 4. Minutes of December 4, 2010 regular meeting approved.
- 5. Committee reports

A. Common Area

- 1. Nothing new on overgrazing of conservancy area.
- 2. RC Ghormley reported CK and contractor reviewed three conservancy areas and agreed that \$470/acre isn't enough for work needed. Looking at doing partial areas or obtaining a matching grant. Holding work until grant decision.
- 3. Several min-fuel breaks have been started. Issue has arisen about getting lot owners permission when breaks run along borders of their properties. Getting

permission will require more salesmanship and asks all POA owners to spread the word of the value of the work.

- 4. Reports about 40 lots requesting wildfire mitigation monies. Would like to see many more participate.
- 5. Board offered thanks and kudos to RC & company for all their work on the mitigation.

B. Bridge Committee

- 1. Bob Scott reported work is proceeding on getting RR to open the Morley exit. Trying to get county commissioners to help, has verbal approval from several commissioners. Bob noted that if Exit 2 (Morley crossing) is re-opened then there probably be only minimal work needed on steel bridge. Assumes heavy traffic would be diverted to Morley crossing.
- 2. Advised insurance agent that we would not be purchasing the bridge insurance policy discussed in last POA meeting.

C. Roads

- 1. The 2011 Road Surfacing Plan was proposed and <u>approved by the POA</u>
 <u>Board.</u> See Appendix for details. At \$25,000 per mile this leaves a cushion of \$150,000 after completing 4.5 miles of road work.
- 2. Some maintenance work was in process or completed.
- 3. A discussion on snow removal resulted in a request for lot owners to call in their snow depths to Al Tucker or John Noard so they can set priorities after a snowfall.
- 4. Recommended that next road committee meeting review and update the 'Master Snow Plowing Plan.
- 5. Also noted that the Road Maintenance Contract will be updated at the next Committee meeting. Changes would be submitted to POA Board for approval.
- 6. New pipe planned for the old Morley culvert which is collapsing.

D. Covenants

1. A Covenant Committee meeting will be scheduled before next POA Board meeting.

E. Finance

- 1. Treasurer (Nancy Allred) submitted Year-To-Date budget and proposed 2011 Budget (see attachments).
- 2. Nancy noted a legal fee of \$13,000 related to foreclosure activities on Lot D47. Money is expected to be recouped upon completion of foreclosure.
- 3. Nancy noted increase in 2011 dues to \$673.09 reflecting CPI rate increase.
- 4. Noted that 35 lot owners are on payment plans.
- 5. Three delinquents are going to attorney.
- 6. Nancy stated that people would not be added to delinquent list if arrangements are made with her.
- 7. Discussion to a have criteria for being on delinquent list for POA vs Metro delinquents the same. Determined different legal requirements made different criteria necessary.
- 8. Board approved proposed 2011 Budget.

F. Communications

- 1. J Allen Aufderheide noted that he has not received responses to his inquires at Qwest regarding feasibility of getting DSL on ranch. 'J' will continue his efforts.
- 2. J noted that Qwest hasn't requested the \$2000 to do a technical study yet. J not sure if study is done/underway/or whatever.

G. Community Preparedness

1. John Parker had nothing to report.

6. New business

- 1. Joe Modica was concerned with the current and future noise coming from the Pioneer gas operations on the west side of the ranch. Joe will continue to contact and work with Pioneer regarding noise mitigation. Bob Scott offered to assist if necessary. Joe noted that Pioneer is adding about 120 new wells in 2011. Joe asked to be contacted if anyone has similar noise concerns. Tom & June Stephens noted they hear significant well noise at their home at the NW corner of the ranch.
- 2. Special note was made of attendance at meeting of Pat Roehl. Pat (up from his home in Florida) is our webmaster and contributes significant amounts of his time to maintaining our excellent SFTR web site. The Board offered its most sincere appreciation for his work.
- 3. It was mentioned from floor that there is a new cell phone company coming to this area in 2011.
- 7. Next regular meeting is April 2, 2011.
- 8. Meeting was adjourned.

- 5. Committee reports

A. Common Area

- 1. Meeting scheduled with rancher to discuss overgrazing of the conservancy.
- 2. Mitigation Work:

43 lots have signed up for individual mitigation, still trying to interest more property owners in participating. Michelle Blake coordinating effort. Tony Riley is working on mini fuel breaks and is trying to get property

owners bordering breaks to allow work. Tony will be working up a map showing current and proposed fuel breaks. Noted work on south Fox Trail as example of work being done.

Conservancy areas being proposed as demonstration site to show how fuel breaks appear after work completed.

Hoping to get 2nd grant which would increase funds available from \$470 to \$1200 per acre.

B. Bridge Committee

- 1. Jim Davis presented draft of letter to county commissioners requesting their backing to open the Morley crossing (Exit 2). <u>Letter approved by board.</u> As soon as this letter is in hand, the Metro will start legal proceedings to open the crossing.
- 2. Bob Scott proposed to supply a rolling scaffold to the Association which allows access to the underside of the bridge for maintenance activities (painting, inspection, minor welding etc.). This would obviate the need for working on RR property and paying associated expenses (ex: two flagmen for \$2000/day). <u>Board approved the approximate price of \$6000 for this work.</u>

C. Roads

- 1. Reported there has been one snow plowing this YTD.
- 2. General road grading will proceed when there is sufficient moisture to be effective.
- 3. The road committee met to upgrade the contract between the POA and our road contractor. New Road Maintenance Contract was reviewed with changes and approved by Board.
- 4. Noted that State contractor working on the Morely Mine cleanup will do road maintenance from the bridge to tunnel 2 for the wear caused by their trucks.

D. Covenants

- 1. A Covenant Committee meeting was held to review the recommendations of Counsel concerning Covenant enforcement and a schedule of fines. An updated version of the Covenants incorporationg these and other changes mandated by the State Statute was drafted for review by the Board. <u>Update</u> was discussed and approved by the Board.
- 2. Updated Covenants will be recorded with County recorder.

E. Finance

- 1. Treasurer (Nancy Allred) submitted Year-To-Date P&L statement (see attachment).
- 2. Nancy noted a legal fee of \$13,000 related to foreclosure activities on Lot D47. Money is expected to be recouped upon completion of foreclosure which is scheduled for April 27.

- 3. Reported there are 22 non-payers with no response to Treasurer's notices. The non-payers will have liens established and be entered on the delinquency list.
- 4. Noted that 66 lot owners are on payment plans.
- 5. Suggested future discussion on payment plans adding interest or fees to payment plans.
- 6. <u>The proposed 'POA Accounting Duties' draft was approved by the Board.</u> See attachments.

- 1. J Allen Aufderheide noted that he has not received responses to his inquires at Qwest regarding feasibility of getting DSL on ranch. 'J' stated Qwest is DOA.
- 2. General discussion of new provider in area (Vaiero) who may request a site on ranch for a tower. Vaiero would require a permanent easement for such a tower. Vaiero would be providing telephone and 4G wireless from tower(s). Waiting for Vaiero to complete their engineering study of possible sites.

Mitigation report-RC Ghormley

- ▲ Work slow due to dry weather and CK unavailability.
- A Continuing work on individual lots, min-breaks and the conservancy break. About 30 individual lot plans approved so far.
- △ Conservancy work still planned to be done by contractor.
- A RC hoping CK can make presentation at annual meeting
- A Question from floor, 'Can the conservancy be reseeded next year'. RC will look into question.
- A RC requested to have map of planned fuel breaks available for annual meeting.

Bridge Committee

A Bob Scott and Jim Davis still working on application to the PUC to open Exit 2. Kevin Blake did surveying for required drawings. Special 'Thanks!!' to Kevin who contributed his time and skills for this effort. Drawing prints being ordered.

Road Committee

- △ 3.2 miles of Gallinas Pkwy, Aspen Trail and Fishers Peak completed.
- △ Gallinas work more expensive (\$56,000 vs \$25,000 est.) due to it being wider and requiring thicker road-base (main road).
- ▲ Keeping an eye on the snow budget.
- A Speeding is still a problem and accounts for much of the premature road wear we are experiencing.
- △ Use of speed bumps was recommended.
- A Covenant Committee will discuss speeding problem at their next meeting.
- An impact fee for new construction was discussed. Will be considered.
- A Road committee will begin holding monthly meetings
- ▲ Buying a share in one of the chippers on the ranch was suggested. Will be researched.

- A Question: 'What about existing tunnel by the cattle corral?' Not feasible because of to the dimensions and demographics of expected traffic. Would also have problems with the stream running through the roadway. The proposed Morley grade crossing has been determined to be a better long term solution.
